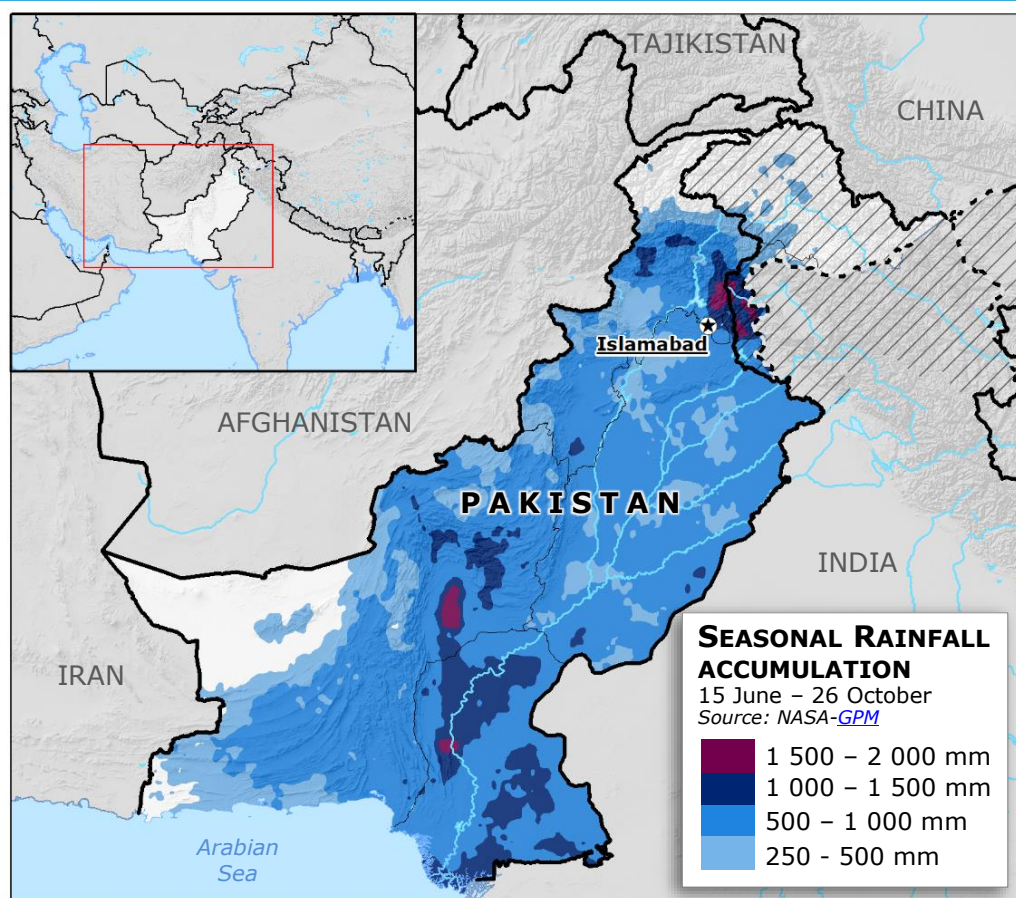


# Pakistan | Monsoon rains - Civil protection and humanitarian response update

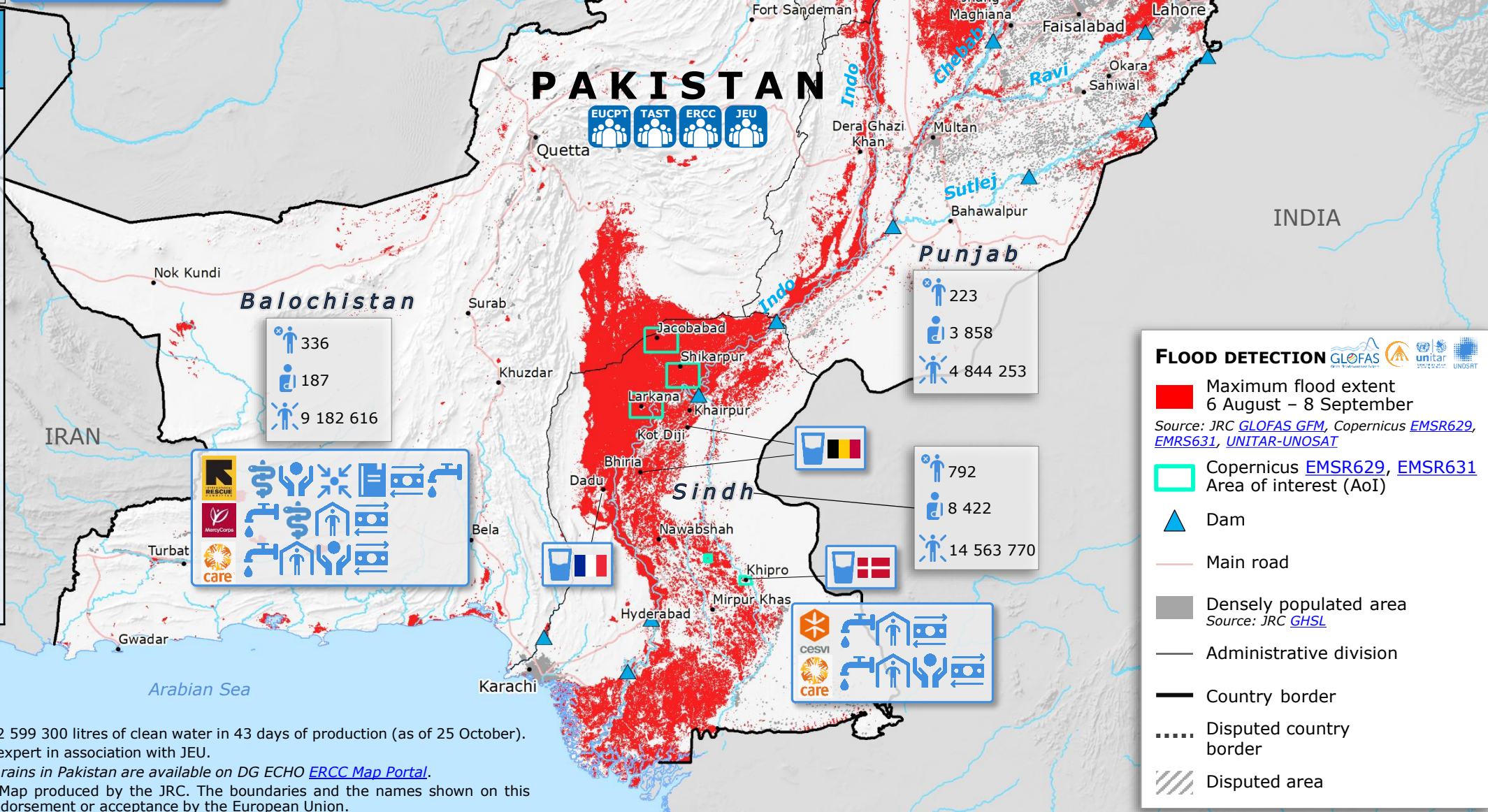

**EU RESPONSE**

- The European Commission mobilized **EUR 32.35 million** in emergency humanitarian funding. On 29 August, the EU Civil Protection Mechanism (UCPM) was activated following a request for assistance from the Pakistani authorities.
- Offers accepted through the UCPM:**

  - BE (Belgium)
  - DK<sup>1</sup> (Denmark)
  - FR (France)
  - GR (Greece)
  - MT (Malta)
  - SI (Slovenia)
  - SE (Sweden)
- Assistance/support received through the UCPM:**
  - EUCPT (EU Civil Protection Team)
  - TAST (Technical Assistance and Support Team)
  - ERCC (ERCC Liaison Officer)
  - JEU (UNEP/OCHA Joint Environment Unit)
- The Copernicus Emergency Management Service was activated twice (EMSR629, EMSR631) to provide 17 satellite maps.
- DG ECHO, using the JRC GLOFAS GFM (Global Flood Monitoring) tool's data, created a dynamic map showing the **extent of floods** in the period up to 30 August.



**EU RESPONSE**

- <sup>1</sup>DEMA WP team produced 2 599 300 litres of clean water in 43 days of production (as of 25 October).
- <sup>2</sup>Deployment of a Swedish expert in association with JEU.
