



### SITUATION

- Tropical Cyclone "KYANT" (previously named "THREE") formed over the mid-eastern Bay of Bengal on 21 October. It then started moving west-northwest over the Bay of Bengal towards eastern India, strengthening. On 26 October at 6.00 UTC its center was located approx. 560 km east of Kakinada city (Andhra Pradesh State, India) and it had max. sustained wind speed of 93 km/h (Tropical Storm).
- Over the next 24 h it is forecast to continue moving west-northwest towards the eastern Indian coastal states maintaining intensifying. It may approach the mid-eastern coastal areas of Andhra Pradesh on 28 October, possibly as a Tropical Storm. Heavy rain and strong winds may affect several areas of eastern India, especially the states of Odisha, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu.
